Let's Celebrate!

In **Class 1** this week, children have enjoyed listening to Bible stories. Our favourite was Daniel in the lion's den.

This week in **Class 2**, children Year 1 have been practising their measuring skills! They started with non-standard units and then moved onto using a ruler and measuring in cm. They picked different things around the classroom and measured how big they were and then compared different items and discussed which ones were bigger or smaller.





This week has been Bible Studies week. In **Class 3** we have learnt the Bible is split into different books written by different people and that we are able to split the Bible into two main books; Old Testament and New Testament. The Bible is important not just to Christians, but also other faiths. Judaism is based on the Old Testament for example. One of our activities is shown here.

In **Class 4** this week, we have continued our work on fractions, rather tricky, so we got the fractions walls out (and cake!) to help us work out which fractions were the biggest.







In **Class 5**, we have been learning all about Scandinavia this week. We used atlases and google maps to find the location of the countries, including the names of the seas surrounding each country. Following this, we have investigated the human features of each country and are now looking into the physical features to find out more about each one.
